Blackboard Discussion Board Quick Guide On the course menu, select Tools and then Discussion Board. The main Discussion Board page appears with a list of available discussion forums. On this page, you can perform these actions: Select a forum title to view the messages. Forum titles in bold contain unread posts. Select a forum to open the thread of posts. Select the number in the Unread Posts column for quick access to a forum's unread messages. Discussions | Blackboard Help Discussion Board page. Doesn't seem familiar? Jump to the "Ultra" help about the Discussions page. The discussion board is commonly accessed from the course menu, although you can provide a link to it in another course area, such as in a content area. The Discussion Board page contains a list of all the forums you've created. You must first create one or more forums before users can start message threads. For smaller course groups, you can also offer group discussions where only members of the group may access the discussion. Open a user's menu and select a new role for them. The new role appears in the Forum Role column for the user. If you want to show only one role at a time, make a selection in the Display Forum Role list and select Go. It can enhance communication between you, your peers, and your instructors when used in conjunction with traditional on-campus courses and provide a forum for discussion in fully online courses. Discussion Boards - Blackboard Student Support A forum is an area of the discussion board where participants discuss a topic or a group of related topics. Within each forum, users can create multiple threads. When your instructor creates a forum, they may or may not let you start threads. Forum page. When you access a forum, a list of threads appears. The discussion content is available only to the members of a course group and your instructor. thread name to read the thread or select multiple threads using the check boxes and click Collect to read multiple threads. 3. Click the Reply button to reply to the thread. 4.
